

We are excited to offer an academic partnership between Marymount Manhattan College (MMC) and Touro University's Doctor of Physical Therapy (DPT) program. This is a unique opportunity for Marymount Manhattan students with a science background planning for a career as a DPT.

Physical therapists are healthcare professionals who are experts in movement and movement dysfunction. They work one on one with patients to restore function, eliminate disability, and help people improve their quality of life. DPT's work with patients with a variety of impairments such as musculoskeletal injuries, neurological conditions, and cardiopulmonary disorders.

Students who are interested in pursuing a Doctor of Physical Therapy degree and meet all the requirements for the program will be given priority review of their applications, dedicated assistance from Touro University's admissions department, and a guaranteed interview. ABOUT TOURO'S DPT PROGRAM:

The program begins each year with the fall semester. In only three years you can become a highly skilled, sought-after physical therapist who provides hands-on care to patients of all ages in a variety of settings including hospitals, rehabilitation centers, outpatient clinics, schools, theaters, and sports teams.

All students will earn a dual B.S./DPT degree upon graduation. You are then eligible to sit for the board examinations to obtain certification and licensure to practice. A bachelor's degree is not required for entry, though many of our students have already earned an undergraduate degree before applying.

The curriculum combines academic and clinical coursework with an emphasis on critical inquiry and clinical problem solving. During the second and third years, clinical experiences are integrated at the end of each semester.

Our faculty consist of clinically active experts in their fields. The majority of our faculty are certified clinical specialists in their fields including, orthopedics, neurology, pediatrics, geriatrics and cardiopulmonary PT.

We keep class sizes small with approximately 35 students per year, which allows us to get to know you and to offer learning experiences schools with larger classes cannot.

Our locations in New York City and Long Island permit students to choose from major New York City hospitals and institutions across the tri-state area and the nation for their clinical experiences — and our graduates excel in the clinic. Many of them have job offers waiting for them before they graduate.



APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:

MMC students wishing to apply to Touro's B.S./DPT program must meet the following requirements. Check out shs.touro.edu/dpt for more detailed information:

Satisfactory completion of 90 transferable (grade of "C" or better) credits. These must include 15 credits in one subject taken to satisfy a major or minor of which 9 credits must be upper division (300 level and higher) courses, 15 elective credits, and at least 60 credits in the Liberal Arts and Sciences. Specific course prerequisites include:

- **8 credits of Biology**
- **8 credits of Physics**
- **8 credits of Chemistry**
- **6 credits of Anatomy & Physiology**
- **6 credits of Psychology including General Psychology**
- **6 credits of English Composition, or Composition and Literature****
- **3 credits of college-level Mathematics**
- **3 credits of Statistics**
- **42 additional credits, of which at least 12 must be in the liberal arts.**

*** The DPT program admissions committee may waive the English Composition and/or English Literature requirement for those applicants who already possess a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university and have satisfied their English/Writing requirement.*

Other requirements for admission include:

- **A minimum GPA of 3.0 for all coursework**
- **Graduate Record Exam (GRE) scores minimum of 148 verbal and 147 quantitative**
- **Two letters of recommendation: one from a licensed physical therapist; the other from a student's former college professor**
- **50 documented hours of volunteer/work service in two or more different physical therapy settings**

All applications are submitted through the Physical Therapy Centralized Application Service at apta.org/cas/ptcas. Touro's DPT program has two campuses and the student can select one campus or indicate that they are willing to attend either campus. Admissions are decided on a rolling basis and applicants are encouraged to apply early.
