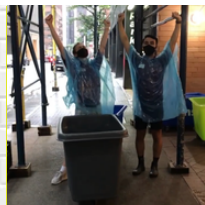
- **Register for a full-time course load (12 credits or more)**
 - All housing students must be registered as a full time student during the academic year.
 - Any questions concerning registration should be addressed to the Office of Academic Advisement at 212-774-0568
- **Pay in full for tuition and residence fees by July 21.**
 - Payment can be made by check or credit card, through financial aid, or by making arrangements for a payment plan. Any questions concerning payment should be addressed to the Center for Student Services at 212-517-0500. Your account must be settled in order for you to move in.
- **Submit your immunization records form**
 - New York State law requires MMC to collect student immunization records for Measles, Mumps and Rubella as well as a Meningitis response. Students can submit their completed Immunization Form or vaccine records for review. Students should upload their records directly to the Admissions Portal. If you have questions, please contact the Counseling and Wellness Center (CWC) at counseling@mmm.edu. More information about vaccine requirements can be found on CWC's website.

THE MOVE-IN PROCESS 06

Coordinating the arrival of 500-plus students in New York City can be quite a challenge, but we have a successful plan in place for the big day!

Our building is located on 55th Street (which runs east to west) between 2nd and 3rd Avenues. On big move-in days the New York Police Department will close parking on the right side of 55th Street from York Avenue (the farthest east avenue) to our building three blocks away. (See map below.)

Cars will begin lining up in the right lane along 55th Street between 3rd and 2nd Ave and continue back as far as needed. When you arrive for check-in, plan to travel towards the building until you see the line of cars with their hazard lights on. It is important to remember that there are businesses along these blocks; please do not block entrances or exits.

We begin to unload vehicles at 8 am on first year student move in days. When a car has reached the building, we will have our Resident Advisors (RAs) come to the car with large bins and assist in unloading all your belongings. Please do not start unloading until a RA approaches your vehicle to begin the process. While this is happening, the student will be inside the building getting their key, ID, and completing any necessary forms.

Due to large move in compacity, we have to limit students to having two move in helpers at a time. Minors and/or siblings count as a move in helper. Move in helpers will receive a wrist banned once signed in.

Please note that moving bins cannot be brought into any parking structures.

Once your car is unloaded, it will need to be moved immediately to make space for others moving in at the same time. If your helpers are planning on staying, there are a number of parking garages in the area. Please make sure your vehicle is always attended during the move-in process.

Marymount Manhattan College is not responsible for parking tickets received during move-in or move-out days.

Depending on your arrival time, this process can take some time. The most important thing you can bring to move-in day is patience! We will work to get students in their room as quickly as possible and your patience and understanding will go a long way in making the day a success!

After move in hours all helpers must be checked in as a guest.

55th Guest policy is:

The host, the student, will meet the guest in the lobby to register with security. Both the guest and host will leave a valid ID with security. When the guest leaves the hall, the guest must be escorted to the lobby by the host and check out at security. The ID cards will be returned when the guest leaves the building. Guest must use the iPad located at the security desk to check in and out guests. Regular overnight guests who are not MMC students must be age 18 or older. MMC students who are age 17 may be an overnight guest. If a sibling aged 16-17 will be a guest, the resident must fill out the Sibling Guest Request Form at least seven days prior to arrival. Guests under the age of 16 are not permitted to stay in the residence hall.

Day Guest Hours are:

Sunday through Thursday 8:00 am to 10:00 pm
Friday and Saturday 8:00 am to 11:59 pm

Students can host two day guests at one time.

Overnight Guest Hours:

An overnight guest is any guest staying past day guest hours, regardless of actually spending the night. Students can host one overnight guest per night with a max of 6 nights per month. Overnight guest must be approved by roommates and an RA.

There are no overnight guests until two weeks after classes start.

For Fall 2025 overnight guest begin September 16, 2025

Overnight guest end two weeks before the end of the semester.

For Fall 2025 overnight guest end December 4, 2025

This is a summary of the guest policy so students are aware of important dates. The full guest policy can be found in the Resident's Guide to Community Living. Students are responsible for knowing the guest policy and all other policies in the Resident's Guide to Community Living.

ABOUT YOUR NEW HOME

Apartments at 55th Street vary in size, housing between four and seven residents in two-bedroom units. Each bedroom can accommodate between two to four people, depending on the size of the apartment. At the time a resident first occupies a room, it will be clean and properly organized with appropriate furnishings. Each individual residence hall space is furnished with a bed, desk, dresser, and closet/wardrobe for each occupant and all windows have blinds.

Room Furnishings

Your assigned space - regardless of apartment size - will come with a bed including mattress, desk, dresser, and closet or wardrobe space. 55th Street has begun to convert from all wooden furniture to metal-framed beds with wooden accessories. The metal-framed furniture allows for a few extra inches of space in the rooms; eventually all rooms at 55th Street will contain this new design.

- **Beds** are **twin XL size** and are designed to be low height, mid-height, lofted, or bunked. Many rooms at 55th Street were designed with lofted or bunked beds, and we have de-lofted/de-bunked where possible. Lofted beds are approximately 5 and a half feet high at the bottom of the mattress. The space below the lofted bed is wide enough for both the desk and dresser to fit (this is our standard setup for lofted beds). Bed ends are designed to be used as ladders for lofted or bunked beds. Ladders and safety rails are available for every lofted and bunked bed. Beds cannot be changed in height.
- **Desk and Chair** are available for each resident. They have a back panel and a bookshelf above the desk section.
- **Dressers** have either three drawers (about 3 feet wide by 2 feet long), four drawers (about 3 feet wide by 2 feet long) or six drawers (about 2.5 feet wide by 2 feet long).
- **Closet spaces** are approximately 2.5 feet wide and 2 feet deep. They have a shelf approximately 6 feet up, and have a clothing rod for hangers. Closets do not have covers; if you wish to hang something to section off your closet, you should get a tension rod which would work for a space about 2.5 feet wide. Some students will have a free standing wardrobe as a closet that has comparable dimensions to closet spaces. Wardrobes do have doors.
- All windows have blinds. Student rooms are not carpeted, but you may bring rugs.

Floor Plans

There are many different floor plan layouts for the 55th Street Residence Hall. When you receive your room assignment in August, you may see the layout of your specific room at <https://www.mmm.edu/offices/residence-life/55th-street-floor-plans/>.

Common Areas

55th Street apartments have a kitchen with a full-size refrigerator and freezer, a microwave, stovetop burners, and a sink, along with plenty of cabinet space. Your common area will have a table and chairs. The shape of the table depends on the size of the room.

Bathrooms have a shower and bathtub, toilet, sink, and a mirror with sections of shelves behind it. Larger rooms with more occupants have either a mirrored vanity sink in the common area, or a second bathroom with a toilet, sink, mirror, and shelves. The shower has a rod, but hooks and a shower curtain are not provided.

Our residence halls are BYOTP (bring your own toilet paper - one ply please).

Decorating Your Room

We encourage you to decorate your room to reflect your personality and style. Use fun-tack or painter's tape instead of nails or tacks for hanging items on the walls—we do charge fines for holes and chipped paint.

Bed Heights

Beds are set at varying heights. Lofted or bunked beds cannot be de-lofted or de-bunked. Should you require a lofted/de-lofted bed as a disability accommodation, please contact the Office of Disability Services to request this accommodation prior to moving in.

Mail & Package Delivery

Residents will receive an assigned mailbox number when they receive on move in day. Any mail will be placed in their designated mailbox. Any package that does not fit in the mailbox, you will receive a package notification to your MMC email address. The package will need to be picked up during the mailroom hours. The Office of Residence Life does not supervise or staff the mailroom. All questions regarding mail and packages may be directed to neopost55@mmm.edu.

Keys

You will receive three keys upon moving in. You will receive an apartment door key, a bedroom door key and a mailbox key. After move-in, any replacement key requests must be made via BuildingLink.

FURNITURE POLICY

Bringing Furniture

At the time a resident first occupies a room, it will be clean and properly organized with appropriate furnishings. For health and safety reasons, students are prohibited from bringing their own furniture into the residence halls. (See boxes below).

Residence Life reserves the right to modify or add to this list at any time. Additional furniture items found within the residence hall will be removed and discarded. Residents responsible for the items will be charged a \$100 fine per item.

Removing Furniture

The furniture provided in your room needs to stay in your room. You should not remove mattresses, chairs, bed pieces, ladders, or other furniture items provided from your room. These items may not be exchanged, replaced, or brought to other rooms in the building.

Public Furniture

Lounge and public area furniture and equipment are for everyone's use. Residents will be charged a \$25/day fine for furniture removal from the public areas.

Rearranging Your Room

Furniture in 55th is set up to optimize the space in the bedroom. Furniture cannot be rearranged or moved. Beds cannot be changed in height. This includes that beds cannot be un-lofted or lofted from the original layout. Furniture cannot block the PTAC (air/heating) unit, and furniture should not be stacked except on Floors 22-25 and 30-32, where dressers can be stacked two high.

Residents who move items will be charged a \$150 improper check-in fine and will need to return the furniture to the original set up.

Prohibited Furniture Includes:

- Upholstered furniture
- Wood furniture
- Wooden book shelves
- Headboards
- Futon couches or chairs
- Bean bags/Pillow chairs
- Any furniture containing cushions or stuffing (including butterfly chairs and papasan chairs)
- Pillows longer than four feet

Acceptable Furniture Includes:

- Butterfly, papasan, or tailgate chairs with nylon seats (no stuffing) that can be folded up
- Metal or plastic shelves no larger than 48" tall
- Plastic storage bins
- New rugs and carpets
- Office or rolling chairs

Roommate Information

All students have the opportunity to create roommate groups after submitting their housing applications and receiving confirmation it has been approved. This ensures all matches are mutual. If matches are not mutual between all roommates requested, we will be unable to place students together. While we cannot guarantee roommate matches, we try to grant roommate requests whenever possible. Roommate groups must be created by July 8th.

While some students will create a roommate group, most will be matched by our office. We try to match students on as many of their preferences from their housing application as possible.

Students will receive roommate information the first week of August. Most students will be tempted to look up their roommates on social media, and while we understand the desire to get to know everything about their new roommates, we suggest students call and talk to their new roommates. Social media can be a poor representation of who a person is; talking is much better. We will not make room changes based on information from online communities, nor for any reasons that are discriminative in nature.

Gender neutral housing is available at 55th Street. Gender neutral housing means anyone may sign up to live with someone of any gender, so long as they have opted into gender neutral housing. You may also sign up for gender neutral housing without a specific roommate in mind; doing so means you're open to a roommate of any gender identity.

Weekly budget is calculated using 17 weeks in the Fall 2023 semester. The weekly budget includes Thanksgiving weekend. Monthly budget is calculated using 4 months in the Fall 2023 semester. September through December was used because there are only one week of August in the semester. Keep in mind that December is a shorter month as well.

Note: MMC Dining Dollars are not a traditional meal plan, and are not meant to cover three meals per day for the entire semester. Rather, Dining Dollars is a declining balance option to purchase food at the below locations. Dining Dollars are supplementary to the kitchens all residential students have in their residence hall apartments.



Tuition and Housing Protection Plan

Marymount Manhattan College has arranged with Gradguard to offer a Tuition Protection Plan. This is an elective insurance plan which will minimize the financial portion of losses incurred when a student suffers a serious illness or accident and has to withdraw before the semester is completed. Renters Insurance

While MMC does not require residents to carry renter's insurance, many residents and their families choose to purchase a separate insurance policy, or verify coverage under a current homeowner's policy.

In the unlikely event of a fire, theft, water damage, or natural disaster, Marymount Manhattan College does not accept responsibility for any damage incurred to personal property. This includes rugs, computers, books, and other personal items. For this reason, the Office of Residence Life recommends each resident invest in renter's insurance. This is a way to protect the resident's personal property should unforeseen loss or damage occur while in the residence halls. GradGuard (described above) also offers a renters insurance program.

FROM AIRPORTS

LaGuardia: Take the Q70 bus to Roosevelt Av & 74 St, transfer to the Manhattan bound E or M train. Exit at Lexington Av-53rd Street. OR take a NYC taxi, Uber, Lyft or Super Shuttle.

JFK: Take the Air Train to the Jamaica station, then take the E train to Lexington-53rd Street. OR take a NYC taxi, Uber, Lyft or Super Shuttle.

FROM THE WEST AND SOUTH OF NEW YORK CITY

Take the George Washington Bridge and follow signs for FDR Drive South. From the FDR Drive exit at 53rd Street (exit #11). Turn right onto First Avenue. Turn left onto 55th Street. The residence hall is located on the right side of the street past 2nd Avenue.

OR

Take I-78 Holland Tunnel. Take Exit 4 from Holland Tunnel. Take West Broadway to West Street. Take FDR Drive to 1st Ave/United Nations Plaza. Take Exit 9 from FDR Dr. Continue on First Avenue, take a left on 55th Street. The residence hall is located on the right side of the street past 2nd Avenue.

FROM CONNECTICUT

Take Route 95 South to Route 278 West to Robert F. Kennedy Bridge. From the bridge take the FDR Drive South exit. From the FDR Drive exit at 53rd Street (exit #11). Turn right onto First Avenue. Turn left onto 55th Street. The residence hall is located on the right side of the street past 2nd Avenue.

FROM UPSTATE NEW YORK

Take the New York State Thruway (Rt. 87) South to the Robert F. Kennedy Bridge (Rt. 278). From the bridge take the FDR Drive South exit. From the FDR Drive exit at 53rd Street (exit #11). Turn right onto First Avenue. Turn left onto 55th Street. The residence hall is located on the right side of the street past 2nd Avenue.

OR

Rt. 684 South to Hutchinson River Parkway to Rt. 278 West. Follow signs to Robert F. Kennedy Bridge (Rt. 278). From the bridge take the FDR Drive South exit. From the FDR Drive exit at 53rd Street (exit #11). Turn right onto First Avenue. Turn left onto 55th Street. The residence hall is located on the right side of the street past 2nd Avenue.

FROM LONG ISLAND

Take the Northern State Parkway (Grand Central Parkway) to Robert F. Kennedy Bridge. From the bridge take the FDR Drive South exit. From the FDR Drive exit at 53rd Street (exit #11). Turn right onto First Avenue. Turn left onto 55th Street. The residence hall is located on the right side of the street past 2nd Avenue.

I can't make my time. Can I come earlier?

Unfortunately, you will be unable to move-in earlier. If you cannot move in during your assigned time, we can make accommodations for you to move in after your assigned time, but not earlier.

Can I switch out my move-in helper for another person?

Yes, you are only allowed to have two people help you during move-in. Only two helpers will be allowed to enter the building at a time. Siblings and/or minors do counts as one of the move in helpers.

What is elevator etiquette during Move-In days?

Our elevator maximum is 6 people. We advise you to walk up or down a flight of stairs if possible when a floor near yours has already been pressed.

Why is the elevator not coming when I press the button?

The elevators will be run on independent service during move-in. This means a person will be inside the elevator telling it where to go. You may use the security call button across from the elevator to notify security you would like an elevator to come to your floor. We ask that you have patience while you are waiting for the elevator to arrive.

I plan to shop for items when I get to the city.

Will I have to wait to get to my room?

There will be limited elevator access during the check-in process. To facilitate our traffic flow, we ask that you wait until after the last move-in window to return to the hall with packages from shopping. If you return earlier with large items, we may ask you to wait on the sidewalk until we can accommodate you in an elevator. This could be an additional wait.

Where can I park to unload my vehicle?

55th Street does not have a parking lot or reserved parking area. Vehicles will be unloaded in front of the building, and then must be moved to an alternate location. We advise you to pay attention to local street signs as parking on streets vary. Please be aware that MMC is not responsible for and will not pay for the cost of any parking ticket received during check-in. Several private parking garages not affiliated with the College are also located in the area (see page 7 for a list).

I'm arriving in taxi, do I need to wait in the car line?

We will have a walk up line for those that are not in a personal vehicle. We recommend asking your hired driver to safely pull over to where you are able to unload and join the walk up line until it is your turn to enter the building. We expect those in the walk up line to be arriving with suitcases as if you just arrived from the airport or train station and will not need a bin to carry your belongings. We do not advise for those with personal vehicles to unload on the sidewalk to join this
